



DOOR-TO-DOOR TIPS

Always Remember

- Do NOT put literature in a mailbox.
- Knock on every door identified on your walk list.
- Report any problems to your canvass captain.

Be personal and concise

- Convey your personal story as to why you're supporting Barack Obama for President. Speak from the heart.
- Use the campaign-provided script to guide your message.
- Don't stay too long at a door. You want to reach your goal of wanting to finish your walk packet.
- Leave literature at every listed door, even if the person is not home.

Be friendly

- Don't argue with people who disagree. Kindly thank them for their time and move on. Your time is valuable, and we need to contact a lot of voters over the next few weeks.
- No matter what, always thank the person at the door for their time and interest when you leave. Remember, you are the face of the campaign.

Be safe and alert

- Don't go inside houses, even in a group.
- Don't knock on a door you feel uneasy about.
- Don't offer to shake people's hands at the door—it can often put people off—but shake their hands if they offer.
