



YOUR RIGHT TO VOTE *in* VIRGINIA

IF YOU ARE REGISTERED TO VOTE IN VIRGINIA
YOU CAN VOTE

IF

...this **is your first time** voting in a federal election at this precinct and you did not include ID when registering to vote...

...THEN PRESENT EITHER:

Your current and valid photo identification (including work or student ID)

OR

Any one of the following that shows your name and address: utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check, or other “government” document (such as your voter registration card)

...this is **not your first time** voting in a federal election in this precinct OR you included an ID when registering to vote...

...THEN PRESENT ANY ONE OF THESE:

A voter registration card, Social Security card, valid Virginia driver’s license, work ID, or any other ID issued to you by a federal or state government.

OR

If you do not have ID you can simply sign an “Affirmation of Identity” and still vote a regular ballot.

- If your name is not in the poll book, please confirm that you are in the correct precinct **before** voting. A provisional ballot cast in the wrong precinct **WILL NOT BE COUNTED**.
- If the poll book incorrectly shows that you moved or already voted when you have not, or an election official or poll watcher challenges you, YOU CAN VOTE a regular ballot by signing an “Affirmation of Eligibility” form.
- If you are labeled an “inactive” voter on the poll book YOU CAN VOTE by either confirming your current address or updating your voter registration information.
- The polls are open from 6:00 am – 7:00 pm, November 4th. If you are in line when your polling place closes, YOU CAN VOTE.
- If you moved and did not transfer your registration YOU CAN VOTE in your old precinct if:
 - If you moved within Virginia after Nov. 6, 2007.
 - If you moved after Nov. 2, 2004, within the same city or county and within the same Congressional District.
- If you are 65 or older, or disabled, YOU CAN VOTE a paper ballot outside the polling place.
- If you applied for an Absentee Ballot, did not receive it, lost it or did not cast it, YOU CAN VOTE in person at the polls.
- You may ask to see a sample ballot and receive instructions before voting.
- You may not be harassed when voting.
